Dear Sir

myself and your friends here are well at present I recieved a Letter from my father in march which Inform<sup>d</sup> me that three of my brothers were out with the ohio malitia at fort megs. we yesterday recieved intelagence that the Creek War is finally at an End. our troops are now Geting their discharges. The Creek propheits have Nearly all Come in and Surrendered themselves Gen<sup>1</sup>. Pinknay & Col<sup>n</sup>. Hawkins are autheriz<sup>d</sup> To treat with them which triaty is dictated By congress. they preliminaries are that they Indians are to pay all the Expence of the Campaign and admit publick road through their Country &c I here anex you a draft of the Battle of the horse Shoe which was fought on the 27<sup>th</sup> March by the Tennessee malitia & 39 Reg<sup>t</sup> of Regulars and the Creek Indians when The Indians were finally Defeated by the unequaled Bravery of the Tennessee malitia Commanded By Maj: Gen<sup>1</sup>. Jackson. I wish you woud wright to me I not heard from you since I saw you I am your affectionate Nephew
